Synopsis

Explore form by three-dimensional techniques. The ideas conceptualized as a flat drawing / sketch on paper will be inspired to take to the third dimension of depth using traditional methods.

Experimenting with different processes and to combine them with decorative surfaces to the created form using, self created small stuffed beads, threads / wire, self decorated wrapped cords, self created wrapped fabric chords.

Introduction

Creating form by three-dimensional techniques. The ideas are conceptualized as a flat drawing / sketch on paper which will be inspired to take to the third dimension of depth using traditional methods. The hands on with materials will create challenges, and generate excitement amongst kids. Experimenting with different techniques will influence their thought process as it takes the shape of form.

Objective

The objective of the workshop is to enhance their skills in terms of material handling ability and put them together. The workshop evolves around explorations with textile materials, wires, beads and combinations of all. They will use traditional techniques like coiling, pleating with self created fabric chords and beaded balls. Besides that they have freedom to add on materials from Nature which can help to get proper form. This will help them think "outside the box" and encourage them to observe and explore ideas on paper to actual form.

Course Content

- Introduction to the various materials.
- Create a mind map to stimulate ideas.
- Nature walking and picking objects that can be part of the form with the materials provided.
- Introduction to various techniques of creating their own self created small stuffed beads, self decorated wrapped cords.
- Introduction to selection of Form.
 Explorations on paper.
- Creating 2 final product with the techniques learnt.
